EMERGENCY SAFETY ALERT

A recent serious incident has prompted this urgent reminder:

It is **IMPERATIVE** that attention be paid and the following discussed and documented **IN DETAIL** when reviewing JSEA's and conducting Safety Meetings:

Line of Fire

Always be aware of where you place your body in relation to moving equipment, suspended loads, and highpressure systems.

- Stay clear of pinch points, swing areas, and drop zones.
- Never assume a machine is off confirm isolation before working.

Proper PPE (Personal Protective Equipment)

Wearing the correct PPE can be the difference between a close call and a serious injury.

- Always wear: Hard hat, safety glasses, gloves, and steel-toe boots, unless otherwise specified.
- Match your PPE to the hazards of the task (e.g., face shield for grinding, hearing protection in loud zones).
- Inspect PPE before each use damaged PPE must be replaced immediately.

Change in Tasks

If your task changes for any reason — even slightly — stop and reassess the risks.

- Conduct a Risk Assessment (L.A.W. Sheet) and upgrade your JSEA. This is your work plan.
- Inform your supervisor of any deviations from the original plan.
- Ensure all tools, equipment, and PPE are suitable for the new task.

Final Reminder:

1. If you're unsure — **STOP** and **ASK**.

Your safety and the safety of your team depend on your awareness, actions, and attention to detail.

Stay safe. Stay alert. Go home safe.
