

WP/SEA MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS TROUBLE SHOOTING ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT



MEMORY JOGGERS

Ensure that the following conditions are met before proceeding. If not met, address on WP/SEA.

- Communicate the "RIGHT TO STOP WORK AUTHORITY POLICY" and is exercised by all crewmembers and other personnel that believe something or some condition has changed. The job is to be stopped and accessed before proceeding. The WP/SEA may need to be modified or a new WP/SEA maybe required before starting the work task again.
- Verify that supervisors are trained in first aid and safety precautions handling energized equipment.
- Ensure that two people are available at work site to alert help or de-energize equipment if needed.
- Ensure all personnel are free and clear of work site so that circuits and equipment can be safely energized.
- Employees should be instructed to be alert at all times when they are working near exposed energized parts where unexpected electrical hazards may exist.
- > Only qualified personnel should troubleshoot are test equipment.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- 1) Verify **All** conditions identified in the "Memory Joggers" section are met (or are not applicable); if **ANY** are not met, **STOP** and add the necessary step to the WP/SEA to ensure the safest method possible.
- 2) Conduct job walkthrough to ensure work area is free from debris, tools, and trip hazards.
- 3) Barricade area with danger tape and post signs.
- 4) Verify rescue plan is written and implemented prior to start of work.
- 5) Verify LOTO is in place and energy is isolated.
- 6) Utilize Flash Guard safety apparel.
- 7) Verify test equipment is calibrated and free from defects.
- 8) Verify that personnel are certified in task being performed.
- 9) Nonconductive clothing and equipment is to be used during testing and trouble shooting.
- 10) Conduct voltage verification test to verify the equipment is de-energized.
- 11) Proceed to troubleshoot equipment with proper test equipment.
- 12) Before re-energizing equipment, ensure all guards and safety devises are in place.
